## **Practice Calendars**

We are excited to announce a new element of training at ABA! For Ballet I-III (we will add Pre-Ballet I and II around awards), we will be sending home a calendar at the beginning of each month. We are asking dancers to practice one hour each week, outside of class time. Please write what, and how long your dancer practiced, on the corresponding day, and initial for them. At the end of the month dancers who turn in a properly completed calendar will receive a prize.

Dancers can practice anything we work on in class, for credit, including stretching/conditioning, barre work, and choreography/awards. Here is a little more detail on each item, in case there is confusion: Stretching/Conditioning: Focus on stretches we do in class, for hamstrings, quadriceps, back muscles. Examples: front splits and side splits, "froggy" and "butterfly". Dancers who have taken pre-pointe can also do exercises learned in class, such as theraband exercises. Barre work: Do exercises learned in class. If your child is struggling to remember what they have done, encourage them to pay extra attention during class time. The basics are always helpful; plie, tendu, degage, ronde de jambe, releve, balances, jumps, etc. let us know if you have questions!

# **Dress Code Reminder Slips**

At ABA, we want everyone to get everything out of classes possible. The dress code is designed to limit distractions, and to help teachers be able to clearly see the dancer's alignment.

We know that no one means to not follow the dress code, but that many families are not sure what it is, or forget. In order to help, we will be sending home friendly reminders, when we note that a dancer is not in dress code. Here is also a reminder of what the dress code is:

For Girls: A solid colored leotard, pink tights, and pink leather or canvas ballet shoes. Hair should be in a tidy bun, which will stay secure the entire class. Black shoes purchased for past shows can be worn, if the dancer has no pink shoes that fit.

**For Boys:** A white t-shirt, black tights, white socks, and white leather or canvas ballet shoes. Black shoes purchased for past shows can be worn,

No undergarments are to be worn in class (boys should wear a dance belt, as needed).

We'd also like to say a few words about ballet etiquette. These niceties are universal in the ballet world, and are good for dancers of all ages to know and practice. It is important for your dancer to be at class on time, in proper attire. Hands should be raised to ask or answer questions, and talking should be kept to an absolute minimum in class. Your dancer should always thank the teacher at the end of class. Please keep absences to a minimum, and be sure to let your teacher know when you have to miss. Dancers should never lean on walls or the barre. Please go over these rules with your dancer!
